With over a year since the start of the pandemic and the introduction of the first national lockdown many families have lost loved ones and we have all faced unprecedented restrictions to our daily lives. # **Nelson Bus Station Toilets**

As you may appreciate the Community Council has been working tirelessly in its bid to get the Public Toilets reopened. Unfortunately, it was never something the Community Council could do



alone as the cost of upgrading/running/maintaining and cleaning the toilets would either have resulted in significant increase in the Precept charged or using a large proportion of the Community Council budget, which would have been at the expense of other events/support previously provided.

The Community Council has now been able to draw together support from Interserve (the Contractor responsible for developing the Commercial units in the village) who have undertaken a redecoration of the building and provided financial support towards the new door entry system. The community Council has provided the bulk of the funding for the door entry system with the facility being run by Caerphilly Taxi Association (who run other facilities across the borough) and they will be taking out an agreement with CCBC for the use of the building and be responsible for its day to day cleansing and maintenance.

It would be remiss of us not to say a big thank you to Interserve and of course the Taxi Association without whose support the Community Council would not have been able to deliver this facility back to the residents and visitors to Nelson. As we enter the final stages of trying to reintroduce this facility we just await the signing of the agreement between the Taxi Association and Caerphilly Council.

There will be a small charge for use of the facility, which will contribute to the running costs of the building.

# Lockdown: Bro Allta and Cwm Rhymni

The staff worked tirelessly throughout all lockdowns, providing hub provision (for key worker children etc.) and online work for the pupils. Currently Cwm Rhymni pupils undertake at home testing twice a week as well as wearing masks when in the school. At Bro Allta, since September, following retirement of the head teacher; the school has been successfully managed by Mrs Meinir Jones from the senior team.

## **Grant Aid**

Despite a difficult year for all, Nelson Community Council has continued to meet remotely and has approved Grant Aid Funding for the following good causes:

#### The Caerphilly Local Development Plan

As you may be aware a Local development Plan, or LDP as it is commonly termed, is a policy document that provides the framework for making planning decisions on all development proposals. The current LDP is now 11 years old and needs to be updated. The Strategic Planning Team have been charged with preparing the new replacement LDP and work on this has commenced in earnest.

I am pleased to have been invited to write a regular piece for the Newsletter to let you know where we are in the LDP process and what events are coming up that you need to be aware of.

The Council are looking to approve the Delivery Agreement, which sets out the timetable for delivery of the LDP and who we will consult/involve and when, at the beginning of June and, when approved by Welsh Government, this will formally commence the 3 and a half years that we have to prepare the LDP.

We are just about to embark on the Visioning for the LDP, a process that identifies the vision of what the county borough will look like at the end of the new plan period (2035) and the objectives for the LDP. As part of this we are holding Member Seminars on 24<sup>th</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> May and 7<sup>th</sup> June where we are looking for input from CCBC Councillors and the Community Councils into this process. So can I urge that your representatives attend these seminars so tat your input can be considered as part of the process.

We will be holding further events in September (Population & Household projections- 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> September) and December (Areas of Growth 25<sup>th</sup> Nov, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Dec). I look forward to seeing you there.
